Devon Golaszewski is a historian of medicine, gender, and sexuality, focusing on the history of reproductive medicine in Mali and francophone West Africa. Currently a Postdoctoral Fellow in the Program in the History of Medicine at Cedars-Sinai Hospital, she received her BA from Wesleyan University and her PhD from Columbia University. Her work examines histories of global health and the development of post-colonial health systems; African concepts of health and healing; reproductive medicine and reproductive technologies; and feminist and gender-based activism in West Africa. Her research has been published in *Gender and History* and *Past and Present*. She is also the co-director of the *Projet Archives des Femmes*, a digital archive of Malian women’s activism from the colonial period to the present.
