Sir, The "Big Read" on Trump's tax overhaul (29 Nov 2017) observes that the proposed cuts for lower income earners will sunset, while those for corporations will remain permanent fixtures. The White House invokes the Bush tax cuts as precedent to argue that Congress will eventually make lower income tax cuts permanent as well. But the comparison is inapt, considering that Bush's sunset provisions had applied across the board, and so Republicans had had an incentive to make them permanent in order to appease their upper income constituencies.
