HOW TO STUDY ABROAD

RESEARCH

Review your remaining UCLA degree requirements (GE, pre-major, major, minor, foreign language, & upper division units).

IDENTIFY

Find UCEAP courses and identify options that are comparable to your degree requirements. They do not have to be an exact match.



DISCUSS

If you have questions, meet the advisors at the International Education Office to review program details and locate syllabi.



CONTACT AFTER TRAVEL

Contact History Advisor to learn how to apply study abroad coursework toward your degree requirements.

- The History Department does not grant pre-approvals for study abroad coursework. However, students can petition for course credit AFTER successful completion.
- Most UCEAP courses count toward upper division units; therefore, even if your department denies your petition, you will still make progress toward your degree.
- A maximum of 16 quarter units taken abroad may be applied toward the History B.A. major.

MAJOR SPECIFIC INFORMATION

Lower Division Major Prep	Yes. If the course transfers back as Lower Division credit, the History department may accept it and apply toward the major prep.
Major Electives	Yes. The History Department allows History Electives to be taken abroad with the exception of the following requirements: HIST 94/96W/97, Hist 187 and Hist 191. These courses are NOT electives and cannot be taken abroad.
List of Pre-Approved Coursework?	No. But courses that transfer back to UCLA as "HIST" can count toward the major/minor. For other courses, students have the opportunity to petition for History credit (see below).

*** Students petitioning a course must do so by week 2 of a given term and will be asked to upload syllabus and one assignment. If a course taken abroad is devoted exclusively to historical content and historical analysis, with written assignments requiring analysis of historical records, it has a better probability for approval than one that does not. ***
